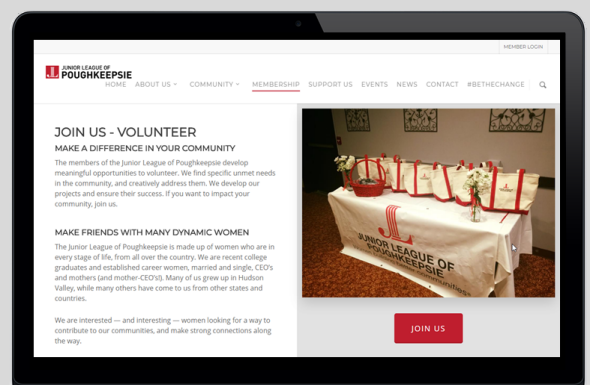
The New JLP Website

The ladies also received monetary donations from family and friends, and held a bake sale at the **Hand and Stone Massage Spa** in Wappinger Falls, which was organized by provisional class member, Rianna.

Donations were also made to replace the toilet and sink in the bathroom near the children's room, and to replace the floor in the bathroom. With the fundraising money raised, they were able to purchase a storage piece for the bathroom, new chairs for the waiting area, and kinetic sand and new white boards for the children's area.

The response from workers in the building was overwhelming - they were incredibly impressed with the work done by the Provisionals and very appreciative at the time spent completing this project. These rooms will truly leave a lasting impact in this community. 2018 AJLI National Conference

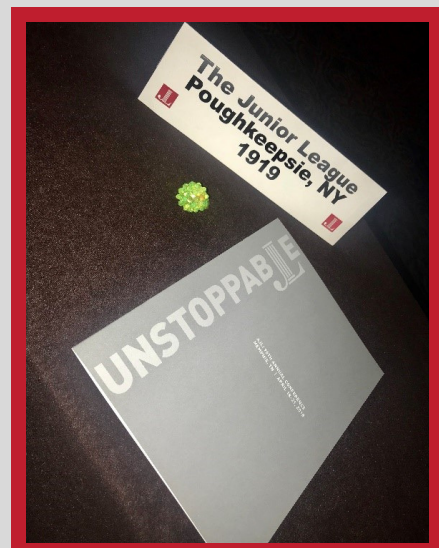

On April 18-21, 2018, **President Linda Fakhoury** and **President-Elect Danielle Strauch** traveled to Memphis, Tennessee to participate in the **Junior League Annual Conference**. This year's theme for the conference was "**Unstoppable**", the new Junior League PSA campaign designed to build stronger overall awareness of today's Junior League, energize membership and external constituents and provide consistency in messaging and compelling visual content showcasing the League—and its members—in a fresh, relevant, modern light.

The keynote speaker for Opening Session was Aimée Mullins. Aimée Mullins revels in the exploration of what is possible—both for herself and those whose lives she touches. She is an actor, a storyteller, a Renaissance woman and an inspirational icon for achieving the IMPOSSIBLE. A double amputee, Aimee didn't allow her life to be defined by that. Aimee's message of never giving up despite one's limitations rang amongst everyone there.

Following the opening session, was the Opening Reception, which was held at the Presley Motors Automobile Museum, surrounded by the amazing automobile and motorcycle collection belonging to Elvis Presley

Throughout the Conference, Linda and Danielle participated in numerous workshops on diversity and inclusion, parliamentary procedure, networking, grant-making, and dialogues with other Leagues, able to be inspired and bring back to the JLP ideas and initiatives for the future and moving the League forward!

Linda and Danielle witnessed three motions presented at the conference: one motion made to change the mission statement of the JLP to make it more concise, one motion to change the name of the Junior League so that the word Junior is removed, and a final motion to open the Junior League to male members. Although all three motions were defeated, there was some amazing dialogue and discussion amongst all of the Junior Leagues around the World, empowering them and giving them a voice!

Closing session Keynote speaker was **Muniba Mazari, National Ambassador for UN Women Pakistan**. Due to a car accident she was in at the age of 21, she sustained injuries which placed her in a wheelchair. Muniba's speech reminded us to have humility and vulnerability to be receptive to other's ideas, use our curiosity to get where we want to go, never overlook the advantages of being different, and that empowering others empowers ourselves. Through her work and life story, Muniba Mazari aspires to inspire those who lose hope. Her singular message to the world is: **"You are the hero of your own life story... and heroes never give up!"** In her powerful and inspiring narrative, Muniba shares how she found a new, reinvigorated purpose out of tragic circumstances...as an artist, motivational speaker and activist.
